In the preface for this 1914 edition, Bailey states that he had intended for the original CYCLOPEDIA OF AMERICAN HORTICULTURE published in 1900 never to be revised, but to stand as a record of horticulture as it existed at the close of the 19th century. It was reprinted, however, about eight times, with corrections but not with revisions per se incorporated. One of these was this edition in six volumes which included a new preface. Bailey says this edition "although founded on the former compilation, is a new work with an enlarged scope" including more tropical plants as well as broader coverage of plants available from European nurseries and cultivated in the U. S. He notes that the two titles should be treated as individual works.

Johnson was a prolific garden writer and edited the periodical COTTAGE GARDENER and its successor the JOURNAL OF HORTICULTURE, both quite popular during the mid-19th century. He wrote primarily on cottage gardening and fruit. In this work he attempts to compile all pertinent information on gardening as well as information on plants that are worthy of garden cultivation. He relies heavily on articles in the GARDENERS' CHRONICLE as well as Paxton, Lindley and Maund. Common names are cross-referenced. Later editions including the 1847 Philadelphia edition are more common than this first edition. \$100.00

This encyclopedia, originally published in 1829, was written by the editor's husband, John Loudon. It was intended to aid in plant identification and is divided into two parts: plants arranged by the Linnaean system and by the system of Jussieu. Descriptions include information on plant habit, duration in the garden, use of various structures such as greenhouses, dry stoves, frames, etc., ornamental attributes, flowering time, color, native country, habitat and year of introduction, propagation and soil. This encyclopedia, written by British horticulturist and writer John Loudon, was originally published in 1829. A major revision was done in 1855 by his wife [see Item #28 above], and this edition is essentially the same as that one. \$350.00

With copious notes on seeds, trees, flowers and hot beds, taken from the fourth edition of Miller's GARDENERS DICTIONARY hand-calligraphed in a very fine hand on both sides of the front free endpaper, the versos of the frontispiece, title, dedication, and last prefatory pages, and the

(34 - cont.) top margin of the first page of the preface as well as the bottom half of the last page of the preface. The handwriting appears to be that of Robert Minnett, who has signed his name on the first leaf of text and dated it July 20, 1764. He writes very neatly in double columns at about 46 lines per page. The book contains an extraordinary amount of information on the plants and gardening practices of the time; American plants are included. Fair copy with early annotations.

Miller's GARDENERS DICTIONARY was issued in nine editions between 1731 and 1835, and was the most respected horticultural dictionary of its time. Likewise, the abridged edition of the work, first published in octavo in 1735 and issued in five editions up to this 1763 quarto edition, were also in great demand for their detailed plant descriptions and information on habitat, cultivation, propagation, etc. \$375.00

Louis-Claude Richard (1754-1821) was a French botanist and plant hunter who traveled to the Caribbean and South America and then became a professor of botany at the Ecole de Medecine in Paris, where he taught from 1795 to his death in 1821. His primary work was this dictionary, originally published in French in 1798. The copy offered here is the first edition (of four) of the English translation done by Amos Eaton. It contains hundreds of definitions and was used by botanists following the Linnean system of nomenclature. This was the first separately issued botanical dictionary published in the United States. \$625.00

The four-volume DICTIONARY OF GARDENING was first published in 1951, and the plan was to keep it up to date by publishing supplementary volumes every five years. However in 1956, this four-volume second edition was published; it was not reset, but it did include some corrections to the first edition, and its supplement, included here, was issued concurrently. The work aimed at "describing every plant suitable for cultivation in the British Isles both outdoors and under glass." In addition, there are articles on gardening operations and techniques, as well as definitions of botanical terms. With dust jackets. This set belonged to Mrs. J. E.
